HAMILTON AVENUE SCHOOL FACILITY AND RELOCATION PLAN UPDATE

Modular Facility Update:

3-18-08: Charles Schwartz, from Environmental Assessments & Solutions, Inc., Michael Long from the Greenwich Department of Health and the independent consultant hired by the Board of Education from Hygenix conferred over the comprehensive set of results and have agreed that it is safe to distribute the materials in the modulars to the relocation schools and/or to storage.

On Wednesday afternoon (March 19th) Hamilton Avenue School staff will be permitted into the building to pick up their personal belongings and to identify materials for packing and moving that are essential for instruction for the remainder of the school year. Packing will begin on Monday, March 24th and moving will begin on Wednesday, March 26th.

3-17-08: Per results of testing received on March 17th, the amount of formaldehyde present is one tenth the amount of the State of Connecticut's guideline.

3-13-08: An environmental report was presented at the March 13th Board meeting providing a summary of testing conducted and results received to that date. A copy of the report is posted to the HAS Update page of the web site.

Transportation:

Dr. Sternberg rode the Parkway bus on Friday afternoon (March 14th) with HAS 1st graders. To address the concerns of the number of students on the bus and the length of the ride, beginning Monday, March 17, 2008, there will be a monitor on the bus and a second bus will be dispatched for the students attending the Boy and Girls Club after school program.

District administration and security personnel continue to investigate concerns around the Weaver and Charles Streets bus stop.

HAS Attendance:

Hamilton Avenue School attendance for last week is in line with the average attendance rate at 95% for March 10th, 94% for March 11th, and 95% for March 12th, 97% for March 13th, 94% and for March 14th.

Connecticut Mastery Tests (CMT):

CMT practice tests were administered to Hamilton Avenue students on Monday. CMT testing for Grade 3-5 begins today, Tuesday, March 18, 2008.
