Greenwich Scholarship Association

GSA is a non-profit organization that awards need-based scholarship from local sponsor organizations and families to students who reside in Greenwich or attend Greenwich High School who demonstrated financial need. Awards for qualified applicants range from \$500 to multiple combined awards up to \$10,000 and are paid directly to the college or university for tuition, room, board and mandatory fees. DEMONSTRATED FINANCIAL NEED IS A PREREQUISITE FOR **CONSIDERATION OF ANY SCHOLARSHIP THROUGH GSA. Financial** need means student's combined financial resources (including income and savings) together with their financial package (grants, scholarships, work study, and subsidized loans) from their chosen school will not cover the cost of their college or university. The online application will be available November 15, 2020 and the deadline for submission of ALL material is March 10, 2021(no exceptions will be made to this deadline). Application to GSA includes: submission of the online application found at www.greenwichscholarship.org, as well as submission of the Student Aid Report (SAR) which is generated when the FAFSA is completed. Applicants who do not meet the financial criteria will be notified in early April. The tentative date for interviews is April 30, 2021 which is required for all applicants (assuming we are able to meet in person by then). Students also MUST submit financial aid packages from their intended school before matching with scholarship funds can be completed. The Roberta B. Willis - Need- Merit Scholarship Program Please see your counselor if you are interested in applying. Counselors must submit all completed student applications by the February 15, 20201 deadline. (http://ctohe.org/rwsp)

Requires eligible high school students to rank in the top 20 percent of their junior year class (upon graduation for all others) and/or have a combined score of 1200 or better on the SAT or have an ACT score of 25 or better. To qualify for the needbased requirement, students must have a federal Expected Family Contribution (EFC) equal to or below our annual maximum EFC cutoff of \$10,999 to be considered for an award. All applicants must submit a 2021-22 FAFSA (htt://www.fafsa.ed.gov) no later than February 15, 2021. Students must list an eligible Connecticut institution on the FAFSA for award consideration. In order to qualify for an award, students must ultimately attend an eligible Connecticut public or private, not-for-profit institution of high education.

The Milton Fisher Scholarship

The Milton Fisher Scholarship is a four-year renewable scholarship open to exceptionally Innovative and Creative high school juniors and seniors, and firsttime college freshman. Award: \$4,000 - \$20,000 Apply for this scholarship if you are...

The scholarship aims to honor students who excel as creative problem-solvers and to help make their higher education goals more accessible.

Eligibility

Eligible applicants to the Milton Fisher Scholarship for Innovation and Creativity must satisfy these two conditions:

1. Applicant must be (a) a high school junior, or (b) a high school senior, or (c) any person entering an undergraduate degree program* in the fall after the application deadline or the following spring, or (d) a student in the first year of an undergraduate degree program*.

2. Applicant must be (a) a Connecticut or New York City metropolitan area resident planning to attend or attending an institution of higher education anywhere in the United States, or (b) a resident of any part of the U.S. planning to attend or attending an institution of higher education in CT or

2021 graduates of secondary schools in Connecticut are eligible to apply IF they are committed to pursuing a career in the field of education. Our criteria are as follows:

Personal and Educational Qualifications:

-Academic record: transcript of grades from Grade 9 through first semester of Grade 12 plus SAT scores, GPA and class rank, if available.

-Character and Personality: as presented in two letters of recommendation and other sections of the application (i.e. volunteer activities, etc.)

-Interests and Educational Activities: as expressed in applicant's essay and other sections of the application.

Financial Need to be determined by the Student Aid Report (SAR) from FAFSA.

Scholarships to be awarded are one four-year scholarship of \$2000 for 4 years (The winner must maintain college grades in the upper bracket and must continue teacher preparation training.) PLUS one 1-year scholarship of \$1500. Students must use the 2021 online application and directions for mailing found at <u>www.artct.org</u>. Each year there are changes to the application form; therefore application forms from previous years will not be accepted. Applicants should print a hardcopy, complete the application and mail it to the board member for their high school as listed on the website. All portions of the application form must be returned in one package, must be submitted in the order specified on page 1 of the application form, and must be postmarked no later than March 31, 2021. Winners will be notified by telephone and a confirming letter early in May
