Security Information for Parents and Visitors to GHS

All visitors to GHS will have their driver's license scanned in a system called "RAPTOR". This system checks the individual for criminal warrants, outstanding court orders that involve injury to children, and scans the national database of sex-offenders. Once cleared through the system, visitors are given a pass to be worn that portrays their picture and the location in the school being visited. **Please, when checking in make sure to have your driver's license and license plate number available.**

Headmaster Forums

Headmaster Forums are relatively small gatherings (20-40 parents) with the GHS Headmaster. The topics for discussion are largely determined by the parents in attendance. All Headmaster Forums will be held in the evening starting at 7:00PM in the Media Center. The next Headmaster Forum for all GHS parents is MONDAY, September 16th.

2019-2020 Student Drop Off/Pick Up Procedures

Parent Drop Off - Following the same pattern as last year, parent drop off before school will be in the BACK of the school. Parents will be directed to enter GHS through the main entrance, drive behind the building and drop off students by the gym. Greenwich Police will assist us in directing traffic. For obvious safety reasons, parents should not drop students off in the street, in neighbors' driveways, or in other entrances to GHS. For your convenience, students may be dropped off at 7:15. They will be minimally supervised until security and other school personnel arrive at 8:00.

Parent Pick Up - Following the same pattern as last year, parent pick up after school will be in the BACK of the school. Parents will be directed to enter GHS through the main entrance, drive behind the building and pick up students by the gym. Greenwich Police will assist us in directing traffic.

NEW FROM THE GHS LIBRARY:

Library Hours - Monday through Thursday, 7:45 am to 4:45 pm; Friday, 7:45 am to 3:30 pm (The library will close at 1:30 pm on Early Release Days and will close at 3:30 pm on Midterm and Final Exam days.)

Media Specialists Alexandra Stevens, Laura Jean Waters, Marie Shimchick, and Susan Morris are available to assist students with accessing appropriate research resources and technology tools for projects and papers, selecting materials for independent reading, logging into and using school systems (Google Apps, Schoology, Aspen, etc.), fixing some technology issues, and more.

Students utilize the library for school work or as a quiet space in these three main areas:

- The back part of the Library (extending from the Career Center to the Science area) where the study carrels are located is for silent study only.
- The front part contains larger white tables and couch/chair clusters for collaborative work and group study.
- Between these spaces are several high top bistro tables for quiet, small group study.

Lunch Block is quiet study only for the entire block (11:19 am to 12:49 pm).

The help desk will still be staffed during school hours. IT support will be available before school from 8:00 am to 8:30 am and during lunch from 11:24 am to 12:49 pm

NEWS FROM THE GUIDANCE OFFICE:

GHS Guidance and the Greenwich Alliance for Education encourages all parents to attend the College Funding presentation being held on Monday, September 9th at 7pm in the GHS Performing Arts Center. A representative from the Barnum Financial Group will share information for families to plan ahead, as well as an overview of the college financial aid process that parents of seniors need this fall.

The PSAT 8/9 and the PSAT/NMSQT will be administered to all freshmen, sophomores and registered juniors on Wednesday, October 16th. Juniors must register in the Main Office anytime from Tuesday, September 10th to Monday, September 23rd. The fee is \$20, payable by cash or check to GHS.

The College Board has made significant changes to the AP Program this year. Students taking Advanced Placement classes at GHS will need to register on the AP website with their classes "join code" provided by their AP teacher in the month of September. Then students must register and pay for their AP exam in the month of October. More details can be found on the GHS Guidance <u>website</u>.

One-for-One on Nine-One-One

On Wednesday, September 11th, Greenwich High School students and staff will participate in the ninth annual September 11th National Day of Service and Remembrance by aiding those less fortunate in the Greenwich community.

With the help of the GHS Roots & Shoots Club and Heroes Club, students and staff pledge to collect at least 2,977 nonperishable, non-expired food items, one in memory of each victim lost that fateful day, seventeen years ago. Throughout the day on 9/11, club members and volunteers will accept donations from students, parents, and staff in a cordoned section in the middle of the Student Center, which will serve as a memorial throughout the day.
