

Greenwich Public Schools Curriculum Overview Course Name: Spanish 3 Native

Personalized learning is achieved through standards-based, rigorous and relevant curriculum that is aligned to digital tools and resources.

Note: Teachers retain professional discretion in how the learning is presented based on the needs and interests of their students.

Course Description: (from COSG)

Prerequisite: Native and Heritage speakers of Spanish who want to improve their literacy skills in Spanish. Students may have minimal experience with reading or writing in their native language. This course is designed for those students who have grown up speaking Spanish at home, but have had little or no formal education in the Spanish language and need to develop strong literacy skills in their first language in order to become truly bilingual. The goal of the course is to impart literacy skills in Spanish, all of which are easily transferable to the development of skills in the area of English language arts. The main focus of this course will be to develop basic proficiency in reading and writing through exposure to age-appropriate literature of the Spanish-speaking world. Grammar and vocabulary will be taught in context through the reading of simple short stories, periodicals, thematic essays and poetry. Students will participate in journal writing and will use technology to enhance their research and writing skills. Upon completion of this introductory course, students will be prepared to enroll in the more advanced and demanding courses which follow, including the Advanced Placement courses.
