- 3. All district staff (e.g. teachers, paraprofessionals, administrative support, custodians, food service)

How are results used?

In depth review by District Administration

4 specific Topics are reported as District Strategic Metrics

- □ Student Valuing of School
- □ Student School Belonging
- Staff School Climate
- □ Parent/Guardian Engagement

Each Topic is a composite of several related questions

School wide results used in the School Improvement Planning process

Timeline

Spring 2017 - First full survey (families, students, staff)

2017 - 2018 - Develop and implement strategies based on 2017 feedback

Spring 2018 - Shortened parent and student survey to gauge progress

Spring 2019 - Second full survey (families, students, staff)

Why use Panorama Education?

What Data was Collected?

Students, staff, and parents were asked a variety of questions in different categories.

The district is using responses in specific areas to monitor implementation and success of the District Strategic Plan.

- Students
 - Valuing of School
 - School Belonging
- Families
 - Family Engagement

What was the response rate at Julian Curtiss?

39.5% of families (94 out of 238) responded to the survey.

93.6% of students (160 out of 171) responded to the survey.

A response rate over 30% is considered a valid data sample.







QUESTION Overall, how much do you feel like you belong at your school?	71% responded favorably	► 2 from Spring 2017	



Challenges

School Safety (new question for 2019)

- How often are people disrespectful to others at your school?
 - Only 28% of students responded positively
 - One of the lowest scores across all areas

• At your school, how much does the behavior of other students hurt or help your learning? (-7)

Strength

Family Engagement - in 80th %ile for this topic overall

- In the past year, how often have you discussed your child's school with other parents from the school? (+11)
- In the past year, how often have you visited your child's school? (+11)
- At my child's school, families are welcomed partners in their child/ren's learning. (New question 83% responded positively)

Challenge

School Climate Indicators

• There are groups of students in the school who exclude others and make them feel bad for not being a part of the group. (-6)

SIP Family Engagement Goal

Julian Curtiss School will increase a minimum of 5 percentage points (from 38 % to 43%) of parents expressing "favorable" opinions on the *Parent Engagement* topic of the 2020 Panorama Survey.

Julian Curtiss School Priority Areas and Next Steps

Common thread throughout survey data (students/parents/staff) was respect.

SIP SEL Goal:

Julian Curtiss School will increase a minimum of 5 percentage points to 66% of students expressing "favorable" opinions on the *School Climate* topic of the 2020 Panorama Survey.

Using the results of the Panorama Survey, we will re-administer the following 2 questions to students in grades 3-5 in the fall and at mid-year to get a baseline and measure progress.

- How often are people disrespectful to others at your school?
- At your school, how much does the behavior of other students hurt or help your learning?

Action plan is being developed in collaboration with the School Data Team and the Safe School Climate Committee and will be finalized by the end of September.
