## TYPICAL FRESHMAN SCHEDULE at GHS

English	1.0 credit	6 blocks – English & Global Studies are teamed
Global Studies	1.0 credit	6 blocks + Sem Skills = 13 or 14 blocks total
Biology	1.0 credit	6  blocks + lab = 7  or  8  blocks total

Math 1.0 credit 6 blocks World Language 1.0 credit 6 blocks

Electives/Other 1.0/1.5 cr 6 blocks + 3 blocks per semester PE/Heath & Safety .5 credit total 3 blocks throughout the full year

Total 6.5 or 7 credits

Typically, students take 6.5 credits in grade 9, 10 and 11, and 5.5 credits in grade 12 for 25 Credits total.

A "full-time" course meets 6 blocks in an eight-day cycle.

A "half-time" course meets 3 blocks in an eight-day cycle.

Courses that meet for a full-year, full-time earn 1.0 credit.

Courses that meet for a semester, full-time earn .5 credit.

Courses that meet half-time (3 blocks) earn .5 credits per year or .25 per semester.

PE/Health & Safety courses meet half-time (3 blocks) and earn .125 per quarter

There are a total of 48 blocks in an eight-day cycle (A-H).

Most freshmen have non-scheduled time for Learning Centers: 3 or 6 blocks per cycle.

A schedule with 5 core subjects (Eng, SS, Sci, Math, WL or Academic Lab) + 1 full time elective + PE = 42 scheduled blocks and 6 Learning Centers = 6.5 credits scheduled

A schedule with 5 core subjects (Eng, SS, Sci, Math, WL or Academic Lab) + 1 full time elective + 1 half time elective + PE = 45 scheduled blocks and 3 Learning Centers = 7 credits scheduled

Students receiving special education services in Academic Lab earn Career & Life Skills Credit = 1.0 (6 blocks) or .5 (3 blocks)

Physical Education (.125 x 2) and Health & Safety (.25) classes will be automatically scheduled for all freshmen.

## **CLASS of 2023 GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS**

25 Credits are required in various subjects and clusters. Graduation Performance Standards must be met in Reading, Writing, Science and Mathematics. Please see the GHS Course of Study Guide for details of these credits, clusters and performance standards.

## To be promoted from grade to grade, each student must accumulate:

- 6 Credits to be considered a sophomore
- 12 Credits to be considered a junior
- 18.5 Credits to be considered a senior
