Langan CT, Inc. (Langan) has prepared responses to written and oral public comments on behalf of Greenwich Public Schools (GPS) for the Remedial Action Plan (RAP) for Western Middle School, located at 1 Western Junior Highway in Greenwich, Connecticut (hereafter referred to as the "Subject Property"). The RAP was submitted to the United States Environmental Protection Agency (USEPA) and the Connecticut Department of Energy and Environmental Protection (CTDEEP) on 1 August 2022. Public comments were submitted in writing via email to the CTDEEP during the public comment period between 16 December 2022 and 17 January 2023, or were provided in person during the public meeting held at Western Middle School on 11 January 2023.

<u>Summary of Proposed Remediation</u>

The proposed remediation includes the excavation and proper off-site disposal of impacted historic fill at the Subject Property, the construction of Engineered Controls (ECs) to isolate deeper remaining impacted fill at the athletic fields, and the placement of an Environmental Use Restriction (EUR) on the property to prohibit actions that would disturb the ECs or expose remaining impacted historic fill. The proposed ECs will generally consist of a minimum 24-inch thick layer of certified clean soil and/or crushed stone with high-visibility demarcation layers placed both below and above the ECs. The proposed ECs will be constructed a minimum 6-inches below all proposed surface materials (i.e. artificial turf, natural grass, asphalt/concrete) to allow future maintenance activities to occur without disturbance to the ECs.

Response to General Public Comments

During the public comment period, 218 comments were received from the public, including 180 comments received by the CTDEEP via email, and 38 comments provided in person or submitted through Zoom during the public meeting. Copies of all the public comments received via email during the public comment period are included as Attachment A and a transcript of the public comments provided during the 11 January 2023 public meeting, as well as comments provided

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through Zoom, are included as Attachment B. The overwhelming majority of the public comments expressed support for the proposed remediation and field restoration. Langan and GPS greatly appreciate the public interest and support for the project and we will continue to work with the regulatory agencies in the interest of seeing the remediation project proceed quickly and safely.

In general, the public comments that requested further information or that were critical of the project were not directed at proposed remediation itself. Nonetheless, given the similar nature/theme of many of non-remediation-related comments, some additional clarifying points are provided below (grouped by topic):

- Timing of Remedial Implementation While supportive of the RAP, many of the comments indicated frustration with the amount of time it took to obtain a consensus on the remedial strategy for the project. It is important to note that the easiest and fastest road to completion for Western Middle School would have been to select a remedy that would not have included special approval from the regulators. However, that option is also considerably more expensive and the most disruptive to the community from a construction perspective; therefore, Langan and GPS were tasked with evaluating numerous potential alternatives. The remedies proposed by the project team are based around protective measures to reduce exposure risks, versus removing everything from the site. These types of risk-based remedies require more thought on the part of the town, Langan, and the EPA and DEEP, which translated into the need to collect a lot for more information before a decision is rendered (hence the lengthy back and forth process). While it would be possible to completely remove all of the contaminated material, it would not necessarily be more protective of public health and the environment than the preferred remedy described in the RAP, and it would extend the timeline for remediation by multiple years. The potential benefit to the community of a complete removal is not commensurate with the significant increase in cost, time, and burdens on community infrastructure and impacts to the quality of life for many years. The remediation plan outlined in the RAP is intended to complete remediation and restore conditions prior to the end of the 2023-2024 school year.
- Tree Restoration Plan In order to achieve the remediation goals for the project, the
 removal of large amount of trees is required along the perimeter of the Western Middle
 School athletic fields. Therefore, the project team is working closely with the Town Tree
 Warden to develop a landscape/restoration plan that acknowledges the environmental
 impact of the proposed tree removals. Following concurrence with the Tree Warden, the
 proposed landscape/restoration plan will be presented during a forthcoming Planning &
 Zoning meeting.
- Proposed Field Restoration/Surface Materials (Artificial Turf vs Natural Grass) The
 Town, including the Greenwich Department of Parks and Recreation, is in full support of
 the installation of artificial grass following completion of the remediation proposed in the
 RAP. The Town notes the following historic points regarding artificial turf use:
 - 1. Over the course of several years, commencing on or about 2003, the Town commissioned public forums, investigations and agency reviews of public health, safety, and environmental impacts of the then potential installation of 5-6 artificial turf athletic surfaces on the Town public school and park properties.
 - 2. The foregoing was commissioned as a result of a variety of public agency, user group and institutional questions regarding the foregoing.



- 3. Numerous public forums and hearings occurred, including agency discussion groups and analysis.
- 4. It was ultimately decided by the Town of Greenwich and its applicable agencies that the benefits of artificial turf installation and usage significantly outweighed any potential negative impacts presented by public and private reviews.
- 5. Since that time, artificial turf usage, particularly including newly engineered materials and designs, has expanded greatly on public and private properties, including scholastic and youth programs.
- 6. In the Town of Greenwich, artificial turf usage and permit requests far outweigh natural turf surfaces and environmental, safety and health complaints have been minimal or virtually non-existent. In fact, requests for new artificial turf construction far outnumber requests for new natural grass facilities.
- 7. While it is acknowledged that there is a place for natural turf surfaces, this is only to point out that the prior concerns and hesitations regarding artificial turf fields have been greatly reduced or eliminated in this community.

Furthermore, the Western Middle School field complex currently has a 90-foot baseball diamond. Remediation and artificial turfing of the fields would have numerous benefits. The artificial turf would enhance the use of the field, and there would be quick recovery even from a significant rainfall. With artificial turf, the field would allow Greenwich High School (GHS) baseball tryouts and GHS scrimmages and games at varsity and other levels. This is extremely helpful as high school baseball begins practicing in mid-March, when grass fields are rarely fully available for team tryouts, practices, and games. Currently, using only grass fields for GHS baseball creates significant additional work on other grass fields and results in more field closings and extra strain on the grass fields. In addition to having a usable baseball field from mid-March to mid-November, the outfield area could be used for other sports. Field hockey should also be played on artificial turf; plus; the community has a need for smaller size soccer fields, especially on artificial turf. Painting lines for other sports would grant much more flexibility to this field, while still meeting baseball needs during the fall season.

Response to Specific Public Comments

Of the 218 public comments received, only 7 were related to the proposed remediation; we believe these comments warranted individual responses. The public comments regarding the proposed remediation are reproduced in italics below, followed by Langan's responses on behalf of GPS (in blue text).

1. A couple days ago, I left a voicemail message for each of you regarding the Western Middle School Remediation project. I have reviewed the RAP. My comments are technical in nature and provided below. I will be traveling at the time of the public hearing but will attempt to join via the Zoom option.

These are my comments in advance.

DA Collins has a history managing PCB contaminated soil and can provide a cost effective, sustainable, environmentally friendly solution in lieu of landfilling.

Low Temperature Thermal Desorption is conducted onsite without transferring the material and liability to another location. This is the same technology utilized at the Freeman's Bridge Road project in Glenville, NY and the Luzern Road PCB Remediation Site in Queensbury, NY. Both projects were performed under the oversight of the



NYSDEC. Case histories are attached. There are many considerations for a project to be a good candidate for thermal treatment. Based on my review of the RAP, this project appears to be a very good candidate.

Thermal Treatment (desorption followed by oxidation) will effectively remediate:

- VOCs
- SVOCs
- PCBs
- Pesticides
- Other volatile organics

The metals hot spots will likely be buffered out during the course of the project due to the nature of the material handling and feedstock-blending for thermal. Benefits of onsite thermal treatment include but are not limited to:

- Contaminated-soil truck traffic in the community is eliminated;
- Liability for the material is not moved from one place to another, the liability for the material is terminated via our technology
- Imported-backfill truck traffic in the community is eliminated;
- Material is processed on site and returned to the excavation as clean backfill;
- Eliminate the unnecessary utilization of ever growing landfills;
- Eliminate mining for backfill;
- Eliminate ongoing monitoring in most cases (dependent on the level of excavation and treatment);
- Eliminate future liability for all stake holders;
- Provide an alternate remediation option at lesser cost

DA Collins not only provides thermal treatment, but can also provide a turnkey suite of services for the entire project including excavation, treatment, backfill and restoration. We would appreciate the opportunity to discuss the project and present our technology in more detail prior to the public hearing if possible.

(Email from Phil Theriault to CTDEEP, 5 January 2023)

The use of alternative remediation technologies were evaluated during the remedial design process; however, such technologies (including thermal desorption, bioremediation, phytoremediation, etc.) were deemed to be inappropriate due primarily to regulatory compliance considerations, site restriction issues, and the level of effort that would be required to implement the alternative remediation technologies.

2. Hello, I am writing in emphatic support of the Western Middle School field remediation project. I am very invested in this project. I not only live down the street, both of my children were impacted by the closure of the fields and I do not wish to see any more WMS students being limited in their use of outdoor facilities. It is not equitable. Many students at WMS also experienced field closures at their elementary schools (New Lebanon and Hamilton Avenue) and our local park (Byram Park). The school is in an Environmental Justice census block and backs up onto the town's transfer station and a factory that has significant tractor trailer traffic and the exhaust that comes with it. This area deserves better and it's time to get this remediation under way.



In relation to the existing environmental concerns noted above, I do hope that the large number of trees slated to be removed as part of this project will be minimized to the extent possible and that any trees that are clear cut will be replaced with shade trees. We are also expecting construction on two parcels at a town property across the street from the school and would like to see truck traffic on Western Junior Highway and the surrounding residential streets thoughtfully considered and coordinated should the projects overlap. Perhaps access to the fields could be from the town's transfer station or multiple access points (transfer station, Hamilton Avenue, and Western Junior Highway) could be used to mitigate the disruption, noise, and safety issues that come with trucks moving large amounts of soil off of the property.

And while I understand the likely necessity, I am also disappointed that artificial turf will be used. The lack of trees in our area and the expected loss of trees from this project and two others in the area are significant. The loss of grass and the heat from artificial turf will only exacerbate the area's poor air quality (we are also close to I-95) and contribute to a heat island effect. As a current member of our local Representative Town Meeting and a former board member of the Byram Neighborhood Association, which advocates for the neighborhood around the school, I do understand the need to strike a balance between the costs and benefits of this project and that we may have no choice but to use artificial turf, but I hope that the final project plans take these concerns into consideration and find creative and cost effective ways to mitigate the negative environmental impacts.

I am looking forward to this project finally moving forward and seeing the youth of our community having safe and accessible fields available to them.

(Email from Lucy Von Brachel to CTDEEP, 18 December 2022)

Thank you for your comments on some of the many issues that the Town, regulatory agencies, and scientists and engineers have considered in developing this remedial action plan. The management of truck traffic during remediation activities has been a major consideration during the remedial design process. Due to the access/space limitations and the presence of the residential streets, the use of Western Junior Highway is not being proposed during remediation/construction activities. Instead, the proposed access/egress point during remediation is from Muskrat Pond Drive, located to the northeast of the field near the Transfer Station.

The use of artificial turf as a playing surface at the athletic fields was a field restoration decision due to its limited maintenance when compared to natural grass and not dictated by the remedial design. The areas surrounding the athletic fields are proposed to be restored with natural grass. In addition, the design team is working with Dr. Gregory Kramer (the Superintendent of Parks and Trees and Tree Warden for the Town of Greenwich), arborists, and landscape architects to save as many existing trees as possible and to develop a planting plan that will replace trees within the proposed remediation area.

3. Dear Mr. Wilcox, I write as a 30-year resident of Greenwich, CT and a current member of the Greenwich RTM. The paragraph below (red) is taken from our First Selectman's recent newsletter, encouraging residents to contact you with views on the CT DEEP Remediation Project.

I would like to state my suggestion that draining the swamp in Greenwich, Hartford, and Washington D.C. would be the best pathway to curing the PCB contamination problems in our town.



Anyone with a high school education in science and a decent amount of common sense can figure out that no one is or ever has been at risk from trace amounts of PCBs ten feet deep in the soil around our schools. That is, if one even believes "the science" that tells us we have this problem. From Wikipedia on a one-minute search: "In general, people are exposed to PCBs overwhelmingly through food, much less so by breathing contaminated air, and least by skin contact."

The soil remediation scam that local, state, and federal governments are running with this nonsense is raping our community and others of 10's of millions of tax dollars which will likely approach \$100 million in Greenwich alone (between GHS and WMS) by the time you are finished, if you ever will be. Rather than spending millions more at Western Middle School I hope that someone in Greenwich or Hartford with true integrity will hire a great investigative journalist to expose this criminal shakedown of our citizens—I estimate that would only cost in the neighborhood of less than \$100K. A bargain!

I would further suggest to you that anyone without eyes wide shut can see this, and increasingly so. Perhaps the result of your further studies and the community discussion tonight will result in a fresh conclusion that any contamination of the soil is naturally resolved when sunshine and rain degrade and wash away PCBs and any other pollutants. And with the 100% absence of any documented cases or even claims of harm, which I have never seen in the press here during 30 years of residency, I hope you will decide to abandon this path of corruption upon which your contractors are embarked.

Western Middle School fields

As the new year begins, the Board of Selectmen is focused on the long-overdue remediation of Western Middle School's playing fields. The state's Department of Energy and Environmental Protection (DEEP) and Connecticut Environmental Protection Agency is holding an in-person and online public hearing on Jan. 11 at 6 p.m. at Western Middle School and people can also send their views to CT DEEP's Remediation Project Manager Jeffrey Wilcox at jeff.wilcox@ct.gov.

(Email from Christina Volkwein to CTDEEP, 11 January 2023)

Elevated concentrations of contaminants of concern (COCs), including volatile organic compounds (VOCs), semi-volatile organic compounds (SVOCs), polychlorinated biphenyls (PCBs), pesticides, and metals have been detected in soil at the Subject Property between the ground surface to as deep as 9 feet below ground surface (bgs). These contaminants have been detected at concentrations exceeding the CTDEEP Remediation Standard Regulations (RSRs) cleanup criteria developed to be protective of both residential and industrial/commercial uses. PCBs have also been identified in soil above the concentrations allowed under the federal Toxic Substances Control Act (TSCA) and its implementing PCB regulations. These state and federal regulations require that the Town perform remediation at Western Middle School.

The proposed remediation strategy was chosen in consultation with CTDEEP and the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) due to its level of protection of human health and the environment, compliance with regulations, long and short-term effectiveness, reduction of toxicity, ability to implement, and cost effectiveness relative to other potential alternatives.

4. Hi, good evening. I'm just a mom, I don't represent a board and I haven't written anything. I have three kids and I'm new to the community here. So many wonderful and articulate things have been said about the reasons why we all stand in support of this. I just think it feels a little weird that I have to stand here and say that. I have a 7th grader that's here, I have a 4th grader that will be rising. This is my second school year here in town, I moved here from Hong Kong where I spent 11 years and I'm also a little dumbfounded that we



have this situation with the school, I didn't think that it would exist here. I wish you all luck. I support a plan that is safe for the children, and I would like to say that based on previous experience that I don't support remediation happening while those kids are in school. I hope that can be a part of it, these things usually do take longer than their supposed to but for all the reasons so beautifully articulated tonight I do hope things can move forward as quickly as possible.

(Public meeting comment spoken by Christine Zibilich, 11 January 2023)

The proposed scheduling of remedial excavation activities has been one of the major considerations of the remedial design process. Due to the close proximity of the school, the anticipated truck traffic, and the nature of the proposed work, limiting remedial activities to only summer breaks is preferred; however, this would substantially increase the length of time to complete the remediation as well as the cost. Due to the short summer vacation, the time associated with contractor mobilization and demobilization, and the technical nature of the work, the anticipated completion time of the remediation during only summer breaks would be around three years. The remediation schedule currently proposes beginning during the 2023 summer recess and completing remedial activities within a single school year. The use of alternate trucking routes via Muskrat Pond Drive, rather than past the school building along Western Junior Highway, and implementation of best management practices, including community air monitoring and dust control, construction site hygiene practices, and secure site access will allow for the remedial activities to occur during the school year in a way that is protective of public health and the environment.

5. You mentioned earlier the water table. The hydrostatic pressure, have you measured that? Have you gotten the direction of the runoff, the subsurface runoff, and if it reacts to the hydrostatic pressure of a storm? Have you tested downstream, offsite? You might consider sampling offsite in the future.

(Public meeting comment spoken by Peter Alexander, 11 January 2023)

Between 2016 and 2022, 10 groundwater monitoring wells were installed at the Subject Property at both up-gradient and down-gradient areas of the site as well as throughout the athletic fields. Overburden groundwater has been encountered between 7 feet bgs at the southwestern portion of the athletic fields and 16.5 feet bgs at the western portion of the recreational area. Groundwater has not been observed in overburden (soil) on the central or eastern portions of the athletic fields; groundwater has only been encountered in bedrock in these areas. Bedrock groundwater was observed between 14 and 25 feet bgs at the central portion of the athletic fields and between 18.5 and 22 feet bgs at the eastern portion of the athletic fields. The inferred bedrock groundwater flow direction is to the southwest.

Both overburden groundwater and bedrock groundwater aquifer samples have been collected and analyzed for site-specific COCs, including VOCs, SVOCs, PCBs, pesticides, and metals. Given the fields have been open to infiltration since the placement of the historic fill in the early 1960s, the groundwater analytical data indicate that the COCs present within the fill are not leaching into groundwater at concentrations that would present a risk or warrant action beyond that proposed in the existing plan. As such, the collection of offsite groundwater samples is not necessary at this time.

6. How was it determined, the cost of "new dirt"?

(Public meeting comment submitted through Zoom from Cliff Fetner, 11 January 2023)

Approximately 36,000 cubic yards (CY) of clean material is expected to be imported to the site for use as backfill following remedial excavation activities. These materials include drainage aggregate (±11,000 CY), finishing aggregate (±1,600 CY), and certified clean fill (±23,000 CY).



Clean fill is certified through analytical testing to ensure contaminant concentrations do not exceed applicable criteria. Certified clean fill pricing generally ranges between \$40 and \$50 per CY but is dependent on local supply. Drainage aggregate and finishing aggregate are both generally sourced from virgin quarried stone. Drainage aggregate pricing generally ranges between \$50 and \$60 per CY, while finishing aggregate pricing generally ranges between \$70 and \$75 per CY. As the project moves forward, the Town will take advantage of opportunities to reuse clean fill that needs to be excavated for construction of the fields and utilize the public bid process to minimize costs associated with the work.

7. If the original testing was done by the perimeter of the groundwater how could it be clean? 1938 the town erected an incinerator. The school was built 1967-1968. That is not accurate and I disagree. Protect our health.

(Public meeting comment submitted through Zoom from Dawn Fortunato, 11 January 2023)

This comment was submitted through the Zoom meeting question portal; however, the specific concerns of the comment are unclear, and therefore it is difficult to answer directly. The planned remedy was developed to be protective of public health and the environment. As previously mentioned under comment #5, both overburden groundwater and bedrock groundwater aquifer samples have been collected and analyzed for site-specific COCs, including VOCs, SVOCs, PCBs, pesticides, and metals, and analytical data indicated that the COCs are not leaching into groundwater at concentrations that would warrant cleanup beyond that proposed in the current plan. In accordance with the RAP, post-remediation groundwater monitoring will occur following remedial activities to ensure remaining COCs underlying the fields are not migrating into groundwater or off-site. According to historic records, Western Middle School first opened in 1963.

We hope these responses adequately address the public comments raised regarding the Western Middle School RAP. Should you have any questions or comments regarding the responses presented please let us know.

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Dear Mr. Wilcox,

We am writing to emphasize the importance of the Greenwich Western Middle School Field Rebuild project. We have lived on the Western-side of Greenwich for the last 16 years and we love the vibrant and diverse community. During our time here, we've seen WMS flourish under the leadership of Principal Beinstein and his dedicated team at WMS. While WMS has realized many successes and offers a great experience to students, the lack of field access for the last 6 years detracts from what WMS can offer and leaves WMS with unequal access to resources compared to other schools in Greenwich - this gap needs to be addressed.

We have two sons who are currently enrolled at Glenville Elementary and our older son is very excited to attend Western Middle School starting Fall of 2024. We believe that having access to fields and sports activities on premise is key to enriching the middle school experience and feel strongly that our sons should have equal access to resources (in this case nearby fields) compared to other schools in town.

We sincerely hope that the remediation plan will move forward as soon as possible so that Western Middle School can have a safe, state-of-the-art field for students and for the community. The remediated field will benefit not just WMS, it will improve field access for the entire town and neighboring communities.

This letter is written by the undersigned, as former Chairman of the Town of Greenwich Field User Committee and the Selectmen's Artificial Turf Taskforce. With respect to the above-referenced RAP, please note the following historic points regarding artificial turf use and discussions in the Town of Greenwich

- 1. Over the course of several years, commencing on or about 2003, the Town of Greenwich commissioned public forums, investigations and agency reviews of potential health, safety, and environmental impacts of the then potential installation of 5-6 artificial turf athletic surfaces on Town of Greenwich public school and park properties.
- 2. The foregoing was commissioned as a result of a variety of public agency, user group and institutional questions regarding the foregoing.
- 3. Numerous public forums and hearings occurred, including agency discussion groups and analysis.
- 4. It was ultimately decided by the Town of Greenwich and its applicable agencies that the benefits of artificial turf installation and usage significantly outweighed any potential negative impacts presented by public and private reviews.

- 5. Since that time, artificial turf usage, particularly including newly engineered materials and designs, has expanded greatly on public and private properties, including scholastic and youth programs.
- 6. In the Town of Greenwich, artificial turf usage and permit requests far outweigh natural turf surfaces and environmental, safety and health complaints have been minimal or virtually non-existent. In fact, requests for new artificial turf construction far outnumber requests for new natural grass facilities.
- 7. While it is acknowledged that there is a place for natural turf surfaces, this is only to point out that the prior concerns and hesitations regarding artificial turf fields have been greatly reduced or eliminated in this community.

The foregoing is not intended to express an opinion on the health or safety of artificial turf surfaces but simply that, in this community, the public is a strong supporter of the reasonable application and usage of artificial turf, together with, and in addition to, well maintained natural turf surfaces.

A couple days ago, I left a voicemail message for each of you regarding the Western Middle School Remediation project. I have reviewed the RAP. My comments are technical in nature and provided below. I will be traveling at the time of the public hearing but will attempt to join via the Zoom option.

These are my comments in advance.

DA Collins has a history managing PCB contaminated soil and can provide a cost effective, sustainable, environmentally friendly solution in lieu of landfilling.

Low Temperature Thermal Desorption is conducted onsite without transferring the material and liability to another location. This is the same technology utilized at the **Freeman's Bridge Road** project in Glenville, NY and the **Luzern Road PCB Remediation Site** in Queensbury, NY. Both projects were performed under the oversight of the NYSDEC. Case histories are attached. There are many considerations for a project to be a good candidate for thermal treatment. Based on my review of the RAP, this project appears to be a very good candidate.

Thermal Treatment (desorption followed by oxidation) will effectively remediate:

- VOCs
- SVOCs
- PCBs
- Pesticides
- Other volatile organics

The metals hot spots will likely be buffered out during the course of the project due to the nature of the material handling and feedstock-blending for thermal.



A \$22MM soil remediation and on-site thermal treatment project in Glenville, New York. Project scope elements included removal and treatment/disposal of over 99,000 CY of Non-TSCA and TSCA soil and debris, and site restoration. The excavation plan called for a complicated 50'x50' grid system of excavations in 2' increments to terminal depths of 6-9' below grade. Excavation grids typically contained a combination of both TSCA and non-TSCA layers were then segregated for treatment or disposal. Excavations also frequently encountered drums with unknown wastes that required special handling. Non-TSCA soils (45,000 CY) were thermally treated in ESMI's mobile thermal treatment plant where all organic contaminants (PCBs, VOCs, SVOCs) were destroyed. Approximately 33,000 tons of TSCA soil and debris were shipped to an off-site TSCA landfill for disposal. An additional 21,000 tons of non-TSCA debris (from screening) was also shipped to a non-hazardous landfill.

Site preparation required clearing and grubbing of over 7 acres, removal of surficial debris, construction of a full perimeter security fence, and installation of all erosion and sedimentation controls over a 13-acre site.

Soil removal consisted of three (3) main excavation areas: South Area (10,000 CY), West Area (45,000 CY), and the TSCA Cell (24,000 CY). Excavations in the South and West Areas utilized a systematic 50'x50' grid system with various cut depths terminating as deep as 23' below grade. Excavation grids typically contained a combination of both TSCA and non-TSCA layers which were segregated for treatment or disposal. Deep excavations were performed in sequential 4' lifts with a strict sloping protocol due to sandy soils.

Non-TSCA soils were pre-processed prior to low temperature thermal desorption (LTTD). On Site Pre-processing including screening out debris to a 2" minus specification and blending the sandy subsoil and topsoil to achieve consistent feed to the LTTD plant. Non-TSCA soils were thermally treated in a mobile thermal treatment plant where the PCBs were destroyed. Treatment rates typically averaged 42-43 tons per hour due to the favorable soil conditions. Approximately 65,000 tons of soil was successfully treated by D.A. Collins to a treatment standard of <1ppm (typical results were Non-Detect).

Due to residential proximity, the community air monitoring program included four fixed air stations with both real time monitoring for dust and VOCs and documentation sampling for PCBs and PM10 dust. Odor suppression and dust suppression were highly prioritized in order to mitigate community nuisance concerns.

All thermally treated soils were reutilized as backfill material and the site was restored with imported topsoil and vegetation.

All site facilities and utilities needed for construction and operation of the LTTD plants were installed by DAC. Utility services included a temporary gas, electrical, water, and communications. The LTTD plant was situated on a temporary concrete slab (over 1,200 CY of concrete) which was removed at the end of the project.

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Hi Jeff,

First, thank you for your work on this project. Having a safe, recreational space for our students and community is critical to our community's health.

I am writing tonight to voice my strong support for remedial action to commence at the WMS fields as soon as possible. With children in the elementary school that feeds into WMS, I am hopeful that both of them will be able to benefit from the use of new, upgraded, safer fields in the near future. I think we can all agree that it's a shame the fields have been inaccessible for so long and many classes have passed through WMS without field access at their schools.

I've spent my career in the environmental engineering field, marketing proposals for projects just like this and reporting out to media outlets on remediation projects that have taken years and sometimes decades to complete. This background gives me a deep appreciation for the complexities around remediation projects - how they must be done correctly, how much care goes into protecting human and ecological health, compliance, consideration of neighboring properties, and more.

But tonight, I'm on the other side of this discussion as a parent, resident, and former WMS student myself urging the team: **let's get it done.** We cannot afford for more students to miss out on field access. Not only does the student experience suffer without immediate access to athletic fields, but the community suffers, too.

Having grown up in a home adjacent to the WMS property, I saw and experienced the impact the field had for after-school and weekend recreation - everything from sledding to sports to bike riding and much more. We spent HOURS taking advantage of these facilities. There are hundreds, actually probably thousands, of people in the neighboring communities who would benefit from closer access to green, recreational space. As you're well aware, the neighborhoods surrounding the school consist of single and multi-family dwellings on modest-sized lots and several apartment complexes. Safe, accessible public green spaces can only improve the strength of this community.

I have heard your name repeatedly as my three children have explored Greenwich youth sports. (If it is a different Jeff Wilcox, please excuse me!) Because of the name recognition I chose to email you and I hope you have a moment to read this email!

I met a woman several years ago who informed me she is the one who reported the soil concerns to the town. She was very proud of the fact that she had been the one to do so. What struck me most was that she didn't care at all about the ramifications to our youth when the fields were closed and she had very little information on what was actually wrong with the soil when pressed. While I would never want our children to knowingly be exposed to dangerous chemicals, I also am frustrated that closing the fields has caused significantly reduced sports resources for the community.

Western Middle School is the school my three children did/have and will attend. My daughter plays field hockey and during the season they have to practice on a half field, with no real goals, due to the other teams that also need field space. Dear Mr. Wilcox:

I am writing to you today to offer my full support for the recommendations in the remediation action plan (RAP) put forth by the Town of Greenwich for the soil removal and clean-up of the fields at Western Middle School. By approving the RAP the state of Connecticut will protect the health of our students and environment while accommodating school activities and other uses of the site.

As you know, the Western Middle School community has been without field access for over six years; completely obliterating its sports programs and limiting its physical education space. Students are forced from their home field and bused all over town to play; including my daughter's softball team. The lack of a home field affects their ability to bond and develop as a team. This has not only negatively impacted their overall middle school experience but is frankly, *inequitable*, *unfair and discriminatory* as compared to students in other Greenwich schools who are not experiencing the same harm.

In addition, during the height of COVID outdoor spaces remained one of the few locations people could social distance, provide a space for safe outdoor activities and serve as a foundation to maintain favorable health and quality of life so vital during the lockdown phase. However, due to the permanent closure of its fields, students at Western Middle School were denied the benefits of outdoor recreation and varying health benefits; including improvement in mental well-being.

Following remediation the design includes the installation of artificial turf. I expect that some members of the community will oppose the proposed artificial turf field, however these type of fields are widely used successfully around the world for many sports and at many levels of performance. Furthermore, thanks to advances in technology and science, artificial grass is safe with several brands of synthetic turf on the market that are non-toxic, lead free and provide a high level of hygienic protection. Tax dollars will not be wasted on the maintenance of more grass fields and a synthetic turf field will prevent countless rainouts due to poor drainage and maintained which plagues many of our fields in town today.

While it is highly likely that by the time the field is accessible my children will no longer be students at Western, I nonetheless respectfully urge you to support the remediation plan and subsequent turf field being proposed in the RAP. Greenwich is <u>well</u> behind our neighboring communities in terms of the quantity and quality of grass and turf fields. The new field at Western Middle School will ensure that the athletic infrastructure meets the needs of our school and the growing community and can support multiple sports programs.

Our student athletes for generations will be pleased and well served by this new state of the art field that both the school community and community-at-large can be proud to call home.

I am writing in emphatic support of the Western Middle School field remediation project. I am very invested in this project. I not only live down the street, both of my children were impacted by the closure of the fields and I do not wish to see any more WMS students being limited in their use of outdoor facilities. It is not equitable. Many students at WMS also experienced field closures at their elementary schools (New Lebanon and Hamilton Avenue) and our local park (Byram Park). The school is in an Environmental Justice census block and backs up onto the town's transfer station and a factory that has significant tractor trailer traffic and the exhaust that comes with it. This area deserves better and it's time to get this remediation under way.

In relation to the existing environmental concerns noted above, I do hope that the large number of trees slated to be removed as part of this project will be minimized to the extent possible and that any trees that are clear cut will be replaced with shade trees. We are also expecting construction on two parcels at a town property across the street from the school and would like to see truck traffic on Western Junior Highway and the surrounding residential streets thoughtfully considered and coordinated should the projects overlap. Perhaps access to the fields could be from the town's transfer station or multiple access points (transfer station, Hamilton Avenue, and Western Junior Highway) could be used to mitigate the disruption, noise, and safety issues that come with trucks moving large amounts of soil off of the property.

And while I understand the likely necessity, I am also disappointed that artificial turf will be used. The lack of trees in our area and the expected loss of trees from this project and two others in the area are significant. The loss of grass and the heat from artificial turf will only exacerbate the area's poor air quality (we are also close to I-95) and contribute to a heat island effect. As a current member of our local Representative Town Meeting and a former board member of the Byram Neighborhood Association, which advocates for the neighborhood around the school, I do understand the need to strike a balance between the costs and benefits of this project and that we may have no choice but to use artificial turf, but I hope that the final project plans take these concerns into consideration and find creative and cost effective ways to mitigate the negative environmental impacts.

I am looking forward to this project finally moving forward and seeing the youth of our community having safe and accessible fields available to them.

Introductory Comments

The Greenwich Department of Parks and Recreation Administration and Scott Johnson, Chairman of the Board of Parks and Recreation are in full support of the Remedial Action Plan (RAP) of Western Middle School fields. Western Middle School (WMS) field complex is very diverse with great flexibility to benefit a wide variety of sports and to accommodate multiple uses at a time. The parking at Western M.S. is good, with a large parking lot across the street from the School building to supplement the on-site parking. The facility is close to both I-95 and U.S. Route 1, making it easily accessible to the community by car. Not only would Western M.S. be able to resume a full physical education and athletics program on campus, the Greenwich sports community would benefit greatly as well, because of the project. Prior to the closure of the fields at WMS, Parks and Recreation would schedule roughly 1900 hours of community use on the fields in addition to the use by Greenwich Public Schools. We anticipate gaining more than the 1900 hours of field time for the community once synthetic turf fields are in play at WMS.

The Baseball Field at WMS

WMS field complex currently has a 90' baseball diamond. Remediation and synthetic turfing of this field would have numerous benefits. Obviously, synthetic turf would enhance the use of the field, and there would be quick recovery even from a significant rainfall. With artificial turf, the field would allow Greenwich High School (GHS) baseball tryouts and GHS scrimmages and games at varsity and other levels. This is extremely helpful as high school baseball begins practicing in mid-March, when grass fields are rarely fully available for team tryouts, practices, and games. Currently, using only grass fields for GHS baseball creates significant additional work on other grass fields and results in more field closings and extra strain on the grass fields. In addition to having a usable baseball field from mid-March to mid-November, the outfield area could be used for other sports. Lines for a field hockey field and a 9 v 9 and/or a 7 v 7 size

soccer field could be painted on the baseball outfield. Field hockey should be played on synthetic turf; plus; the community has a need for smaller size soccer fields, especially on synthetic turf. Painting lines for other sports would grant much more flexibility to this field, while still meeting baseball needs during the fall season.

The Main Field at WMS

The plan for the main field will provide for a variety of uses. This would include a full-sized multi-sport field which would accommodate football, 11 v 11 soccer, a universal lacrosse field, rugby, and flag football. With the removal of the hill, the Town should be able to include a 46'/60' softball field with the likelihood of including a 50'/70' baseball field that would be for WMS Softball and potentially adult softball and youth baseball. The diamond field would probably best be in the existing Field #1 area to reduce sun and glare in the batter's and catcher's eyes. This would help WMS Softball in spring and community softball / baseball programs even more in the summer. The main field would primarily be used for other sports in the spring and fall seasons. The Town would also pick up beneficial practice space by the former #2 softball field at WMS. This space could possibly host a 7 v 7 or 9 v 9 soccer field and could also be helpful for sports practices such as flag football practice and for smaller group instruction.

Community Needs

The WMS RAP project will help ease some critical future field space needs. First, the construction of a new Central Middle School (CMS) will create severe problems not only for the CMS athletic teams and physical education program, but also many other community users who rely on this field space. The new CMS building will be constructed on the existing field space and will take several years to complete. Secondly, the construction of a new Hamill Skating Rink may temporarily create a problem with field space at the current rink location. Additionally, field maintenance projects which are continually needed and the potential alterations on existing school buildings, necessitate the provision of alternative field space. These issues continue to cause a shortage of field space for the Town. Any additional field space, especially synthetic turf, will help to ease the overall field shortage. Therefore, the Department of Parks and Recreation Administration and Scott Johnson, Chairman of the Board of Parks and Recreation express their full support of the Western Middle School Fields Remedial Action Plan.

I am a current homeowner and tax payer at 224 Byram Shore Road in Greenwich, and we have 4 children in the Greenwich Public Schools: 8th grade and 7th grade at Western, and 5th grade and Kindergarten at New Lebanon School.

My daughter is graduating Western this year as an eight grader and has never once had access to the closed fields at Western the entire time she attended middle school. She played softball, ran track and usually had to be bussed to other places to practice and have games. My son in currently in 7th grade and has also never had access to the fields, either. And unfortunately, they really did not have much access to the fields at New Lebanon School for the bulk of their elementary school years as well. I am the concerned parent of an 8th grade student and current 4th grader who will be attending WMS in a little over a year. With that said, my 8th grader and 4 of his cousins who also attended WMS have never been able to enjoy the field. I would be very disappointed and saddened to have another one of our family members not be able to use this space.

WMS has not had field access for 6 years. We, as a community, are not okay with WMS fields being out of commission for a third generation of WMS students, not to mention the many children throughout the Greenwich community who would otherwise be able to use WMS fields for football, soccer, softball, field hockey, etc.

This has been an inconvenience, and quite frankly unequal access, and hardship has been caused by the fact that WMS fields have been off limits for this long. This remediation is long overdue and am confident that this situation would not have played out for this long had this been the central or eastern part of town. Thanks to you and the entire team working on the WMS project.

I am writing to express my strong support for the remedial action plan to be implemented as soon as possible. I serve on the BET, the Town's Finance Board, but I am writing as a community member and as a parent who spent time on the now closed fields with my oldest son when he played baseball in the Cal Ripken league.

In August 2016, I was the Chair of the Board of Education when testing confirmed the presence of certain contaminants on the middle school fields. Our interim school Superintendent, Dr. Sal Corda, consulted with Town leaders and department heads and made the rapid fire decision that the fields should be closed in the best interests of safety for our kids and the community at large. This decision was made and executed literally in the week just before the start of the school year. Principal Gordon Beinstein and his team, along with Parks & Rec, came together and worked it out so the students had a PE and after school sports programs.

The Board at the time was wrestling with suboptimal fields at Hamilton Ave. School and the William St. field being out of commission due to the new New Lebanon school project so it was particularly vexing to have the fields at Western MS also be impacted.

Our town has demonstrated the capacity to execute projects of this magnitude. We did so at the site of the former Cos Cob power plant and we're doing so currently in a multi-year phased project at Greenwich High School.

I believe this critical project, after 6 plus years and countless rounds of testing and discussion, needs to move forward. The community has been patient but the students and the community deserve to have their playing fields restored in a safe and expeditious manner.

15 RATIONALES FOR USING **NATURAL GRASS**, **NOT ARTIFICIAL TURF**ON THE GREENWICH WESTERN MIDDLE SCHOOL FIELDS

Outdoor activities are crucial for everyone, especially children. Time outside not only helps physical well-being, but also improves emotional and intellectual health. Scientists and educators state outdoor play directly impacts a child's stamina along with gross and fine motor skills. That is why I support plans to clean up the Greenwich Western Middle School athletic fields. However, I am opposed to topping the remediated areas with artificial turf.

Environmental impact:

- The most obvious environmental problem with artificial grass is it's rooted in the biggest climate nemesis of all: fossil fuel. Synthetic turf is made from a stew of petroleum-based components, making it nearly impossible to recycle. Typically, worn out AT is disposed of by sending it to landfills or burning. This leads to toxic leachates and pollution. There are no regulations at the federal levels on turf disposal.
- 2. Microplastics are created during AT production, usage and via degradation of the artificial grass blades and are not biodegradable. Researchers have done the most work on microplastic risks to marine organisms, and now they are exploring effects in human tissue. Recent studies detecting microplastic pollution in human blood show infants and children are most highly vulnerable.
- 3. AT creates heat islands, causing detrimental effects on both human health and the natural environment. It increases land surface temperatures by 40% or more and hardens soil thus increasing stormwater runoff.
- 4. Usage and maintenance practices cause the plastic grass blades to fray. As a result, fibers are transferred into the air and water. Additionally, reports reflect the necessity of replacing on a continual basis infill that has migrated into water and surrounding areas.

PFAS, lead, and other chemicals:

- 5. The blades and backing of artificial turf are made with PFAS, called "forever chemicals" and are linked to cancer, birth defects, and other serious health problems. Children are considered more vulnerable to exposure because they are smaller and their bodies are still developing.
- 6. As for alternative infill (sometimes called plant-based infill or PBIs), there is a lack of transparency. Researchers point out the growing methodology and possible chemical treatment in prior use is undisclosed, misleading or grossly exaggerated. No long-term study on the effects of children inhaling PBIs has ever been conducted.
- 7. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) warns that the petroleum-based "plastic grass" made with nylon or some other materials contains lead.

Health and personal injuries:

- 8. The high temperature of AT on warm days can heat up to 40-70 times hotter than the surrounding air and leads to skin blisters and burns, dehydration, and heat stroke.
- MRSA, an infection that doesn't respond to antibiotics, can happen after skin is scraped or cut. Synthetic turf is more abrasive than natural turf grass, and as a result, breaks in the skin are more common, creating a pathway for infection.
- 10. Reports show players on AT face a 32 percent higher rate of non-contact knee injuries and a 69 percent higher rate of non-contact foot or ankle injuries on turf than on grass.

The cost myth:

- 11. Taxpayers have been led to believe artificial turf fields are cheaper than natural grass due to lower expenses for upkeep. But non-partisan studies have shown the exact opposite. Natural grass field costs are typically less than AT over its useful lifetime due to huge costs to install and maintain them followed by the expense of continually replacing migrated infill, and then the high cost of disposal of the worn-out turf.
- 12. The ability to recycle used artificial turf is a marketing ploy. Less than 8% of plastic turf is recycled. Because of chemical damage that occurs with each reuse, plastic can be recycled once or twice at most.

Advantage of natural grass:

- 13. installed and maintained natural grass remains viable for at least twice as long as AT. Natural grass sequesters carbon, increases oxygen and keeps the surroundings safe and cool. It effectively captures airborne pollutants, smoke particles, and dust, pulling them out of the air.
- 14. While AT is impermeable requiring product and labor to clean mucus, spit, sweat, blood, bird and animal droppings on what should be a regular basis, natural grass is self-sanitizing.
- 15. Real grass serves as a carbon sink (absorbs more carbon from the atmosphere than it releases). The soil it grows in contains bio-diverse communities of organisms that are essential for clean water and air. Nitrogen-fixing bacteria and other live micro-organisms help soil break down harmful contaminants and serve as an essential ecosystem for a healthy environment.

It makes no sense, and is anathema that the WMS field plans detail the process for removing and managing **toxic** soil and then choosing to finish the process by including a top layer of **toxic** plastic grass!

As a community, how much risk to our children's health are we willing to tolerate in the name of field time and cutting costs?

I urge all RTM members to review the <u>Remedial Action Plan (RAP)</u>, which includes the testing results of every soil sample at various depths, and other materials that are linked through the <u>GPS fact sheet</u>. If you weren't able to make it to last night's meeting, here is the video.

To add some context and to correct some misinformation shared in the email below, the testing of soil samples from Western Middle School found PCBs, Lead, Chlordane, Arsenic, and DDT at depths of ONE INCH or more, with many samples above thresholds at depths between 3 in. and 3 ft. Some found toxins at levels exceeding TSCA thresholds for hazardous waste in shallow samples. The school opened in 1960 and unfortunately 60+ years of sunshine and rain have not been effective at degrading and washing away these toxins. Because exposure is predominately through food, we don't actually want these PCBs to wash away to the Sound or to our nearby community gardens where they will become part of our food supply.

I am troubled by the argument that there is a 100% absence of any documented cases or claims of harm. There are many different kinds of PCBs, pesticides and contaminants and they vary in how they cause harm, where and how long they hang around, etc. In addition to cancer, PCB exposure can damage immune, reproductive, nervous, and endocrine systems. The toxicity of these chemicals has been determined through decades of scientific study. I, for one, do not require additional proof in the form of sick or dead Greenwich residents to feel confident that remediating contaminated soil on playing fields at a school is the right thing to do.

I hope that my other colleagues on the RTM will join me in supporting this project and submit comments to Jeff Wilcox (<u>jeff.wilcox@ct.gov</u>), DEEP's Remediation Project Manager who will be taking public comment until the 17th.

Good morning Mr. Wilcox,

It was very nice to meet with you last night and thank you for taking the time to host the hearing.

I was delighted to hear all of the public input and certainly understand how important the need for playable field space is for the Town of Greenwich; particularly for the western area of Greenwich. The sense of optimism and progress could be felt throughout the auditorium room.

My concerns are the amount of trees that are planned to be removed surrounding the fields and abutting other properties. With the tree removals there will be negative ecological impacts to human health, the environment, significant loss of tree canopy and wildlife corridors.

Through some research it was discovered that the western section of Greenwich has the least amount of tree canopy and is the most densely populated. When this fact was discovered, The Greenwich Tree Conservancy, with the Parks Department and Conservation Department's support, applied for the Connecticut Urban Forest Council grant to assist in the replanting of trees in order to regain tree canopy.

The grant funding was awarded and tree planting had commenced the spring of 2022. The tree loss at Western Middle School will likely be over one hundred and will negate the amount of trees that were planted. In actuality, the loss will exceed the planted amount.

I hope this project can be review holistically, with a keen eye to saving trees if possible, and to replanting native trees, shrubs and perennials that will provide all the positive ecological benefits and campus beautification. Far too long landscaping has been seen as an afterthought, when in fact for this project it is an opportunity to highlight how working together, the end product offers so much to the community. In a sense an outdoor classroom. Teachers can take students out on campus and talk about the entire restoration process and how the newer plants will support various ecological needs.

Thank you for offering the opportunity to comment on the project of remediation of the playing fields at Western Middle School (WMS) in Greenwich, CT. The Greenwich Tree Conservancy is a 1000 strong non-profit organization with the mission to preserve and enhance the tree canopy of Greenwich for the benefit of all residents. Tree canopy in Connecticut gives our towns and cities a sense of place, and yet our forests and trees are under increasing assault. Extensive tree cutting practices result in increased noise, air pollution, flooding, pesticide use and in many areas a decrease in property values.

The playing fields at Western Middle School (WMS) have been closed since September 2016 and now finally the end is in sight with remediation beginning this summer. The Tree Conservancy is in full support of this remediation. At the same time, it must be noted that this school is in an area of town with little tree canopy. An area with this level of canopy is defined as Environmental Justice as residents are unable to enjoy the benefits tree canopy provides in other parts of towns. CTDEEP's definition states where the community "bears a disproportionate share of the risks and consequences of environmental pollution." *CTDEEP's Environmental Equity Policy, 1992.* Indiscriminate clear-cutting is deforestation. With over 100 mature trees surrounding the fields slated for removal this is in effect deforestation, even more disturbing given its proximity to I-95, rail corridor and Route 1.

We write to ask you to work thoughtfully and closely with the town to save as many trees as possible. Based on the contaminate mapping, there appear to be areas where little or no contamination has been found, specifically in the existing wooded areas.

At a time when there is widespread acknowledgement of the importance of trees in combating the ill effects of a changing climate, the removal of valuable woodlands should not be allowed without indisputable data proving the necessity. Loss in such a densely populated area will undoubtedly result in unforeseen consequences for nearby residents and particularly unfair to the many school children and their families who will be using the adjacent fields.

A plan to judiciously tag trees for removal using low-impact guidelines while sparing as many mature specimen trees as possible, will result in a healthier neighborhood for all who live, work and play there. It is also critical to replant as soon as possible with larger caliber native trees to allow these areas to restore this

environmentally challenged area as soon as possible. In the past, replanting on school properties has not been done in a timely manner. Please do not let that happen here.

Dr. Gregory Kramer, Town Tree Warden, has spoken with Patrick Haskell of AECOM about this project. In addition, Dr. Kramer has engaged Davey Tree to do an analysis of the trees and will be able to incorporate this data into the decision-making process. Dr. Kramer's expertise is a great asset and GTC is confident his planning will provide the ecological benefits this community deserves. We ask and urge DEEP to work with Dr. Kramer to meet the goals of remediation and reforestation at Western Middle School for the health of its surrounding community.

Good evening. My name is Lauren Russell. I have two children who are current and future Western Middle School students. I am here to express my full support of the school field's soil remediation, reinvigoration and utilization, highlight some underlying benefits that the fields would offer and offer my gratitude for those who have been so dedicated to this endeavor.

In recent years, Greenwich and the region has been a U.S. epicenter of the global pandemic. This particular part of Greenwich has been hit unusually hard because we have more students below the federal poverty level than any other middle school in Greenwich. Since the onset of COVID-19, this district's top priority was understandably to keep our children and community safe. The pandemic brought understandable chaos: changes were instituted with little notice as new data factored into safety protocols. Our field, as we know, went unused during this entire time.

Due to our socioeconomic profile at Western, which does not reflect most schools in Greenwich, our students and their academic performance was hit unusually hard by the pandemic. COVID adaptation brought isolation and interruptions in our children's education that have had significant unintended consequences. I've spoken to many other parents and common changes as we "return to normal" include anxieties, fears around personal space, difficulties not experienced before in navigating social issues with their peers, increased overall fragility and sensitivity and struggling with self-esteem.

The idea of a new field shines like a beacon of light. Athletics and recreational opportunities would support our children. Sports mirrors life in so many ways: it's filled with adversity and competition; it demands mental toughness, teamwork, and continual improvement; and it's packed with many inspirational stories. And a remediated field would offer our students opportunities that include, but far surpass solely athletic endeavors.

The idea of fresh turfs - fresh starts - offer a new paradigm for our students in the form of an even field in which teammates supporting each other is paramount; on the fields, individuals' social currency increases based on model behavior. I predict that it would be a paradigm shift to many students to understand that the values our school and

society prize - on and off the fields - would include respect accountability, honesty, empathy, determination, teamwork and commitment.

I know I am not alone in facing these uncharted stressors for our children, who are at critical developmental ages that will forever shape their understanding of how the world works. I find a renewed sense of hope in the reintroduction or athletics and recreational field opportunities. More than ever before, the reimagination or these fields will expand learning opportunities beyond the confines of the classroom and provide a safe, enjoyable environment. For many, the lessons held by the potential of the fields will change their lives by providing opportunities for students to choose positive channels to engage with their peers.

The pandemic-centric years affected students, parents, teachers and staff through transitions in and out of classroom-based learning and prioritizing necessary safety measures over all else. NOW is the time that our community must take stock of the balance our children need to recalibrate the well-rounded education offered to Greenwich students. Our children's perception of their self-worth, potential and ability to thrive in areas outside of the academic sphere are in need of the opportunities these fields could be more than ever before.

A school should have balance between the safety of a cradle and the freedom of a wide open field. It saddens me greatly that our school has lacked the latter—a literal field—for a shocking six years. I wholeheartedly endorse this field remediation endeavor. I have high hopes that these fields will be the future backdrop of school spirit, peer comraderie, and a center of mental and physical strength that will also facilitate a healthier, more transparent foundation for social structures and values. I cannot wait to cheer on Greenwich students as they enjoy their renewed fields.

Thank you to Connecticut Department of Energy and Environmental Protection, the Greenwich School District and Board of Education, the PTA and all others who have come tonight in support of the field remediation. I appreciate all of the effort and resources that have been dedicated to the this project and thank you for your time tonight!

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Hello Mr Wilcox,

I'm a parent of a Western Middle School 8th grader. We are actually districted to Eastern Middle School, but applied to Western's excellent magnet program and were accepted when my son entered 6th grade in the fall of 2020.

My now-8th grader has never (and will never) be able to play on the WMS fields before he graduates. He has not had gym class, after school intramural sports or lunch break on the fields that surround his school. When the kids have a middle school team sport that requires a field, they are bused to an alternate location.

It is more important than ever for our kids have access to fresh air and places to be active, both as part of their physical education as well as at lunchtime, after school activities and sports. Time spent outdoors and physical activity have long been linked to improved mental health as well as increased focus at school. For too many years, our kids have not had the use and benefit of the fields surrounding Western Middle School. It is a resource that we really need, but going unused.

People tend to think about Greenwich as monolithically affluent, but across our town there is actually quite a bit of economic stratification and diversity. In general, the farther west you go, the less affluent it becomes. Our students represent an incredibly diverse group of people, but unlike the east side of town, our school typically qualifies about 50% of our kids for free and reduced lunches. These diverse qualities are a real strength of Western Middle School and a wonderful part of living in Greenwich. Living on the east side of town and attending school on the west side of town has opened my eyes to the economic realities faced by many families at Western Middles School. I suspect that if a school on the east side of town went several years without the use of their playing fields, there would have been a heck of a lot of noise made to accelerate the remediation of said fields. Not having the use of outdoor fields as our other two middle schools do is a matter of equity.

I hope that the kids at Western Middle don't have to wait much longer to play school sports and have gym class on their own school grounds. All these children are shipped everywhere. Parents not able to do sports with their children because their children had to go to a different destination. They don't have that afterschool buses and everything else. That's where the real punishment has come from, not from the guys that are able to go and pick their children off to their sporting events, but the people that don't have that ability to do so; we have a dearth of athletic opportunities for our children here in the field area, whether it be from the littlest all the way through the softball or through soccer all the way through baseball. One final question I would say is: is it possible that we can look at how you lay out those fields as we go forward? Is it possible that perhaps the concrete pathways should be made of a little bit different substance? So if the kids are in their spikes they won't actually run up to a concrete slab and become slippery, such as we see at straza, that might be something worth paying attention to. as a Western Wildcat, my youngest never had the opportunity to step foot on her home field at Western Middle School. I'm standing here tonight to offer my full support for the recommendations and Remediation Action Plan, put forth by the Greenwich Public Schools for the soil removal and clean-up of the fields at Western Middle School. Our middle school fields are used by the schools for the physical education programs, intramurals, interscholastic teams, and other school events. The same fields are also used by the community for youth and adult athletic needs and other community programs and events. In 2018 Greenwich Parks and Recreation, who manages new teams, Greenwich public school fields, clocked approximately 6,000 hours of use a year on our middle school fields, and I'm sure that the usage is only increased in the past 4 years. In 2020 the town conducted an athletic field study which only highlighted what many of us knew; that Greenwich has an insufficient number of athletic playing fields, and that the existing fields are overused. Having access to Western's long-closed fields would not only benefit the students but the entire town, by giving us access to more field time. There has been so many challenges, but in meetings everybody is doing their best to make this happen. In September of 2016, we're called into to his office, and its like, "Hey, there's some bad news," Now, with Gordon, that can mean anything. But in this case it was that we had no fields, and he's like, "What are we going to do" and I'm like, "You mean, no fields, like no fields?" and he's like, "We have no fields." But luckily we're working with Donald Moore in the town. We were able to do Strazza Field, which is across the street. So what we did was, as phys ed teachers, we rode bikes, and the kids ran from our school to Strazza Field, and in a short period, 42 minute periods, we did our best to implement the physical education curriculum, which was obviously super challenging. So at that time they were testing the field and fortunately we were able to get a small portion back, and that was positive, in that we were able to be back on campus, which allowed us to do, you know, like, obviously, more because we're here and it's less transition time. And then COVID hit and so we didn't have the gym. So we lost the gym, and we had like a small portion of the field, so we used the tennis courts. And so the point I'm trying to make is for like seven years now, all it's been is we got to get done for the kids, and kids have been great and resilient; and the staff here meaning my colleagues, and Gordon, the administration, Dr. Jones. Donald Moore and Tim Coughin from the town have been great in creating this site for us and our track team sort of practices on like this little patch of grass. But we can't have any home games. So these kids, where you want to talk about like school spirit—and if you ever came to one of our basketball games, for, like our championship, our tournament stuff, it's packed, and the kids can't wait to play in front of these kids, their peers. So it's been so impactful on our kids in so many ways. And it's just time; it's been enough. The kids have been resilient enough, and it's time—this is sort of what we believe. Here is, we take a negative. We gotta turn into a positive. So let's make this feel the best field in Greenwich, the best field in this town. "Good evening! I represent Greenwich Parks and Recreation. The Greenwich Department of Parks and Recreation Administration and Scott Johnson, chairman of the Board of Parks and Recreation are in full support of the Remedial Action Plan of Western Middle School. This field complex is diverse and has great flexibility to benefit a wide variety of sports and accommodate multiple users at a time. The parking at Western is good, with a large parking lot across the street from the school to supplement onsite parking. The facility is close to I-95 and US Route 1, making it easily accessible by car. Not only would Western be able to resume a full physical education athletics program on campus, the entire Greenwich sports community would benefit greatly as well. Prior to the closure of the fields at Western, Parks and Recreation would schedule about 1,900 hours of community use on the fields in addition to the school use. We anticipate gaining more than 1,900 hours of field time for community use once synthetic fields are in place at Western. The field complex currently has a 90 foot baseball diamond, remediation and synthetic turfing will have numerous benefits. With artificial turf the field would allow Greenwich High School baseball tryouts, practices, and games at varsity and sub-varsity levels. This is helpful as high school baseball begins practice in mid-March when grass fields are rarely available. In addition to having a usable baseball field from mid-March to mid-November the outfield field could be used for other sports. A field hockey field or small size soccer field but easily be painted in the outfield. Field hockey should be played on synthetic turf and the community needs smaller size soccer fields, particularly on turf. The plan for the main field would provide for a variety of uses. This includes a full size multi-sport field, including football, 11 V 11 soccer, boys and girls lacrosse, rugby, and flag football. We plan to include a combination 46-60 softball field and 50-70 baseball field, which would be a huge benefit to Greenwich High School girls' softball for tryouts, practices, and games at all levels in the spring. It would also assist community softball and baseball in this summer. This can provide beneficial practice space to the former number two softball field here. This to provide youth football, flag football, and soccer practice spaces as well. The project will help ease some critical future field space needs. First the construction of a new Central Middle School will create severe problems, not only for central athletics and PE, but also for many other community users who rely on this space. Ongoing and planned field maintenance projects and likely school building renovations will also require additional field space. Any additional field space, especially synthetic turf, will help to ease the overall shortage. "Good evening, and thank you for the opportunity to speak tonight. My name is Jennifer Young, and I'm the parent of two Western Middle School students. I'm here in full support of the remediation plan and construction of artificial turf. As you know, the Western Middle School community has been without field access for over six years, damaging its sports programs and limited limiting its physical education space. Our kids have been forced from their home fields and bussed all over town to play. This has not only negatively impacted their overall middle school experience, but is unequitable, unfair, and quite frankly discriminatory. We, all of us, in this room on this, at this podium, and on the stage, have a duty to ensure that our community resources are equitably distributed throughout the community, and that schools have similar outdoor amenities. A rounded education specifically includes access to opportunities outside of academics without that access we are hamstringing the development and potential of every student on our campus. During the height of COVID outdoor spaces remained one of the few locations people could social distance safely to maintain favorable health and quality of life; however, due to the permanent closure of its field, students at Western and the surrounding communities were denied the benefits of that outdoor recreation and it's varying health benefits, including mental wellbeing. Following the remediation the design includes the installation of artificial turf. These types of turf are widely used successfully around the world for many sports and at many levels of performance. Moreover, experts in athletic field design believe that grass fields cannot support the high use we expect from our sports programs, and that use would leave our fields in poor condition. Tax dollars will not be wasted on the maintenance of more grass fields and a synthetic turf will prevent the countless, countless, I have kids who play lots of sports in this town, countless rain outs due to poor drainage and maintenance which plagues the majority of our fields in town today. I don't have high hopes that when this is approved, we're going to see this turned around in 144 days, and it's likely that the fields will be completed after both my children have graduated Western, but I nonetheless respectfully urge you to move forward immediately. Greenwich is well behind neighboring communities in terms of the quantity and the quality of our fields. The new field at Western Middle School will ensure that the athletic infrastructure meets the needs of our school and the growing community, and could support multiple sports programs. Our student athletes for generations will be pleased and well served by this new state of the art field that both the school, community, and community at large could be proud to call home. "I've learned so much tonight. I've written a lot of notes, I'm going to have to play this one by ear. I want to first off thank the Board of Education, all the people and parents that are here tonight, certainly the DEEP and the EPA, and any of the stakeholders that are here. I'm going to point a question to people on the dais here, I want you to look at the community and please hear what they are saying. I've come from four years in a place that the community has been trying to speak to these very issues. Mr. Wilcox and I've had too many emails, he doesn't want to see another email from me, that's ok, you can respond, but the point here is, look at the community. Now you might ask, who am I? I was here in the same auditorium eight years ago for Mr. Bernstein comments. I was here, maybe before Ms. Moriarty, certainly not before Miss Tarkington was here, back in 2007 and 2008, as a member of District 7, who had become a vice chair of the Land Use Committee. I'll tell you who I am in a moment. I fully support this whole program. I only suggest that it might be more than 20 million in the sense that you've got hotspots in this area that may require further digging. It's all about soil testing, and to the young lady who mentioned why the elected people are doing things I've got to tell you. Look at me, I've been doing this for 15 years on the RTM as a member of the First Harbor Commission, trying to clean up sites in this town and in other places, and it is very difficult when you don't get the community to come out and give you that support. I've been asked by a constituent here that came to us in the RTM land use committee eight or nine years ago, her name was Dawn Fortunato, and she ought to get some credit. I don't know how much, she's pretty direct with people, in getting this thing started with us. It wasn't just 6 or 7 years, it's been about 10 or 11 years to get this thing going, so I am very pleased to hear where it is now, here or tonight, so I can eliminate the statements on the political process with what you have to do to get appropriations and funding. Who is Peter Quigley? I'm a 22 year resident, for 15 years I've been on and off the RTM as a vice chair of the Land Use committee. First member of the First Harbor Commission trying to get these. I was a point person on land use for the environmental water management, to start a funding here. Water management and environmental and land use, properly maintaining a historic scale of this town, and working at it for 15 years. Okay, so I'll go on here, I was going to talk about the funding process, which is the most important, but interesting as I came back I'm now in District 3, I'm in Chickahominy, came back last fall. I don't know why I was put on Parks and Recreation Committee, but I'm on the Parks and Recreation, that's why I'm here tonight. I wanted to hear the community coming out, I knew you were going to come out. We've been trying to do this, forget the 7 years, I've probably been here 12 years. The first time in this auditorium was about eight years ago, and in front of Langan. The MISA project, as Ms. Moriarty knows, I was there in 2008 or '09, talking to a guy by the name of Joe Ross. Who was that? A Vice President of AECOM, but he was also the Chairman of the Building Committee for the High School MISA project. I'll move on to a couple of suggestions and considerations if I can, if you allow me. Those years make it very difficult to do things in 3 minutes, but I'll try to be brief here. The cleanup process, you want to use natural grass, not artificial turf because of the chemicals in the turf. People are sighing about this, this whole project is about the health and the safety of not only the students, but everybody that's on the site, and to any place that has public, won't say congestion, but has public access. You want these sites to be clean, so it might not just be an expense on how quick it's done, you have to be definitely making sure it's done right. Langan's created a beautiful plan here, no question, and I just hope the funding is there if they run into these hotspots. However, to Mr. Fazio, if he's still here, can you raise your hand before I continue? The issue is, I have been in this thing for 15 years, is that the State law needs new regulations to deal with soil testing, and not to residential soil testing, at these public sites. In the case of one place I was in it was actually a brown field and they're dealing with residential, going down 5 inches or even 5 feet, when you have to go down to where this carcinogenic material lies into a certain degree, and that sometimes can be 10, 15, maybe even 20 feet. So to Langan's responsibility is to make sure these hot spots are cleaned up, and to whatever is being capped, it is done as deep and far down as you can do, and honestly, it probably should be the EPA's responsibility. What's going on here in the State of Connecticut? It's that the standards of the Clean Water Act and the Toxic Substance Act of Federal laws, laws that were created because of things called the Love Canal. They are federal laws, the EPA has to come in for oversight to make sure those particular standards are being met, because the State, we don't believe, there is a group of us who don't believe legislation is serious and deep enough to be able to give protection at these public sites. I won't mention the amount of impact it has, you've all indicated, the students, the teachers. How about the teachers that have to be here and the coaches and everybody else, you want to make sure they're on clean soil. I'll leave it at that. I'm glad to see everything's moving along, at least in the funding and the appropriations in front of the RTM. It's a very tedious process in this town, and why it takes as long as it does, and it probably shouldn't, but it does, and things do seem to be moving along there. To AECOM, having lived through these things since 2008 and the MISA project, they have a mixed history of soil testing, as does the DEEP, in my opinion, and I'm just a non-expert, just an opinion of someone who has studied this pretty deeply. I've been there with the Joe Rosss', and the Steve Andersons', and Leslie at the beginning of the MISA project. I'm glad things have moved to a point right now that this is all going to be taken care of, and I do hope it's swiftly, but you have to make sure it's being done right. Also just one suggestion, there is a company called Clean Earth that's a pretty good vendor if you ever need someone to check on putting clean earth back into the soil here.
