l <u>Course Description</u>: ENGLISH ESL 1 Full Year 101700 12 Blocks 1 Elective/Humanities Credit 1 English Credit

Prerequisite: Less than one year of English or by recommendation of the teacher.

This course is designed for English Learners grades 9-12. The emphasis will be on developing academic skills in all four language areas: listening, speaking, reading and writing, with a focus on instruction designed to meet individual student needs. One credit will apply to the English graduation requirement. These students will also be enrolled in Social Studies 1.
