

Personalizing the College Process

Making Your College List

- Make sure every school on your list is a "first choice" school
- Know why you are applying to each school
- Be realistic about the academic requirements for admission
- Think outside the box



The College Search Process

- Figure out who you are and then look for colleges that interest you
- The most selective college may not always be the best fit
- Family discussions
- Frequent contact with counselor
- Gather information from colleges and current students
- Visit college campuses
- Keep an open mind
- Recognize admissions standards and campus culture varies year to year
- Use good judgment when listening to the opinions of others

Some Factors to Consider

- Location
- Size of school
- Level of academic rigor
- Areas of interest/major
- Campus surroundings
- Social life
- Financial Aid / Merit Scholarships

Visiting Campus

- Call Admissions Office ahead of time
- Do your "homework"
- Ask good questions of students, professors and admissions representatives
- Check out the dining hall
- Sit in on a class
- Hang out in town
- Take notes
- Write thank-you notes
- Listen to your gut



What is Considered in the Application Process?

- Academic Factors
 - Transcript:
 - Course selection and level of rigor
 - Course grades
 - Three-year GPA
 - First quarter senior grades (Often required, but not automatically sent)
 - Mid-Year senior grades (Automatically sent)
 - SAT/ACT scores (If required)
 - Subject Tests (If required)

What is Considered in the Application Process?


- Personal Factors
 - College essay
 - Recommendations
 - Demographics
 - Demonstrated interest
 - Extracurricular activities
 - Interview
 - Legacy
 - Supplements
 - Special talents (athletics, art, music, theater)

What is Expected of Students:

- Take ownership of college process
 - Complete and submit applications, forms, essays, etc.
- Provide teachers with recommendation forms several weeks in advance of application deadline
- Proofread your college essays and have them reviewed by counselor and then an English teacher
- Meet ALL deadlines
- Arrange to have official test scores sent directly to college

What students should not do:

- Change your college list after meeting with your school counselor. (Fall of Senior year)
- Hand in Transcript request sheets without informing your school counselor.
- Tell your teachers you need their letter of recommendation by the end of the week (and you hadn't asked for one before hand).
- Apply to only Reach and Far Reach schools.
- Tell your school counselor you are applying somewhere and never send the application.



What is expected of parents:

- Support and encourage your child, offering advice and guidance where appropriate
- Be aware of your own preferences or biases regarding college choices
- Be open to new ideas and suggestions on colleges to consider
- Support an ethical approach to the admissions process
- Your children are expected to complete their own applications

What is expected of counselors:

- Offer students suggestions and guidance about colleges based on the information they provide and preferences they express
- Help students create a balanced and realistic list of colleges they would be happy to attend
- Write a counselor recommendation
- Meet all deadlines (as long as students have met counselor/guidance office deadlines)

Financing Your Education

- Family discussions about the role of finances in college selection
- Use online tools for EFC and Cost of Attendance
- Need-based financial aid- families can begin applying in October 2018.
- Merit-based aid awarded by individual colleges and outside organizations.

- Financial Aid Workshops at GHS

College and Career Center


- Mrs. Lochridge- College and Career Counselor
 - Individual student appointments available after initial college planning meeting with counselor
- College representative visits at GHS
- Junior & Senior year workshops on the application process, college essays, college visits and interviews
- Annual College Book
- SAT, AP, ACT prep books
- College guide books & information
- Summer programs & Gap year information
- College and Career Update

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A comprehensive tool that can be used to help students and parents through college and career planning.

- Take surveys to determine career interests
- Conduct a college search and compare colleges
- Track deadlines and submission of documents
- Schedule visits with college representatives at GHS
- Search for scholarships
- Teachers upload formal recommendations
- Receive communications from Guidance Department
- Complete parent & student components of senior packet



Common Application



- As of today, we expect the 2019-20 application to be live on August 1st 2019.
- Do NOT invite counselor or teachers writing letters on the Common Application. This could jeopardize your application being sent!

■ ESSAY

- 650 word limit (WORD LIMIT ENFORCED)
- Text-entry only no uploads of Microsoft Word documents
- Essay prompts announced in March
- Supplemental essays primarily focus on demonstrated interest & fit
- Other forms of applications: direct to institution, Coalition Application

Components of the Junior Folder

- Senior Brag Sheet (Self-Evaluation)
- Activity Sheet or Resume
- Parent Brag Sheet
- Informal Comments (At least one of each, limited to 2 teachers)
 - Teacher
 - Non-Teacher

Next Steps

- Schedule Junior College Conference
- Review contents of Junior Folder
- Consider timing for campus visits
- Develop a standardized testing plan
- Consider who you want to ask to write a letter of recommendation
- Keep your grades up and begin thinking about next year's course selection
