Dear Parents,

Our team of GPS Elementary Library Media Specialists are THRILLED to share with you some of our favorite children's literature for your summer reading pleasure.

Each teacher librarian has selected a very special picture book and a chapter book for you to enjoy with your child. We also generated a list of "must read" non-fiction books that you can incorporate into a healthy-diet of reading for pleasure during the summer months.

A recent piece in the <u>New York Times</u> suggested that picture books are "one of the literary world's greatest pleasures,"an opinion that resonated in all of us. In that spirit, we recommend that readers of all ages indulge and get lost in the storylines of our picture book recommendations. You may want to ask your child to read the picture books independently or plan to read together.

For our chapter book and nonfiction book recommendations, we have enclosed titles under the suggested grade-level bands. In addition, for independent readers we included suggested titles that you might want to pick up at Greenwich Public Library or your favorite bookstore.

Finally, we generated a list of resources that will bring you to curated book lists by reputable organizations from which you can choose.
