

STUDY SKILLS FOR LANGUAGE ARTS

For Vocabulary:

1. Create flash cards
2. Use mnemonics (hints to help you remember)
3. Create a study set on Quizlet.com
4. Practice reviewing with a partner
5. Write the words in a sentence

For Writing:

1. Print out written work and edit/revise on paper
2. Read your written work aloud to check for errors
3. Use rubric as a checklist
4. Good resource for general writing mechanics:

For Reading:

1. Review homework questions and notebook entries
2. Go over handouts
3. Summarize each chapter or act
4. Use visuals (ie: plot diagram, Venn diagram)
5. Create lists of character traits
6. Anticipate questions by thinking about class discussion
7. Pay attention in class and participate ACTIVELY
8. Review main themes
9. Read and reread
10. Annotate your reading

STUDY SKILLS FOR SCIENCE

For Vocabulary:

1. Use flash cards
2. Create a study set on Quizlet

Quizzes or Tests:

1. Use the review sheet
2. Use all your notes in your science journal
3. Have someone quiz you

General:

1. The science journal is the one essential material needed for every class
2. All homework and classwork is written in your science journal
3. Ask for help when you don't understand a concept

STUDY SKILLS FOR SOCIAL STUDIES

1. Regularly do your homework and pay attention in class
2. Keep an organized notebook daily so you have the materials you need to study. If digital, make sure all social studies materials are in the social studies folder
3. Use class materials, notes, and handouts to complete review sheets provided
4. Add missed information when review sheets are discussed in class
5. When there is not review sheet, students should create a study guide to prepare
6. Write down questions you have while studying so that you can ask them during class or extra help
7. For a test, review class content daily and study for at least two night for at least 20 minutes
8. Attend teacher extra help review session

Suggestions for studying Social Studies at home:

1. Have someone quiz you using the review sheet or key worksheets
2. If no one is available to quiz you, cover up the answers and say them out loud even if you are alone in your room (you will remember them better!)
3. Make a Kahoot, Quizlet, or use any other app that the teacher recommends
4. Practice defining key terms, reading the definition, and coming up with the key term yourself
5. Use a blank map for each unit to practice learning locations

STUDY SKILLS FOR MATH

1. Review your notes and redo problems from your notes, the textbook, worksheets and homework questions; especially those you initially solved incorrectly
2. Make flashcards for vocabulary and formulas to memorize
3. If only the chapter review is assigned as homework, do the book's chapter test for additional practice
4. When the teacher reviews for the test/quiz, make sure you write down the emphasized information
5. Pay attention in class and ask questions to clarify information
6. Start reviewing 2-3 days prior to the test. This will leave you enough time to seek extra help if you do not understand something
7. Use online resources such as IXL and Khan Academy to practice skills you have identified as needing review.

STUDY SKILLS FOR WORLD LANGUAGE

For Vocabulary Acquisition:

1. Create flashcards or use quizlet (virtual flashcards)
2. Use vocabulary lists
3. Practice English - World Language & World Language - English
4. Practice saying words while writing words
5. Use vocabulary words in complete sentences

For Reading:

1. Look for cognates (words that share similarities with English)
2. Look at captions, pictures, and graphs to help your comprehension
3. Read the whole paragraph several times to help you to understand difficult words in context (using clues, reading before and after difficult word)
4. Look up meaning of word on www.wordreference.com

For Quiz, Test, and Oral Presentation Preparation:

1. Begin studying several days before the quiz or test is given
2. Re-read the class notes and use ancillary materials (handouts, sites on schoology, etc)
3. Write practice activities out
4. Practice aloud for speaking test with classmates/ friends
5. Record your oral presentations, listen to it, and edit accordingly
6. Use resources curated by your teacher on www.schoology.com

For Writing:

1. Use complete sentences and start your sentence with a capital letter
2. Use correct spelling, punctuation, and accent marks
3. Write a rough draft and edit any mistakes

Pay special attention to common mistakes such as:

- a. Verb conjugations
- b. Tense throughout passage
- c. Adjective-noun agreement and placement
- d. Gender of nouns and adjectives modifying them

General Practices:

1. Take good notes
2. Ask questions and participate in the lesson/ discussions
3. Be responsible for your homework
4. Check for homework for accuracy and understanding
5. Seek extra help when needed
6. Plan studying over several days
7. Check Schoology, Google Classroom, and Aspen
